ACADEMIC PROGRAM

- Saint Mary's School does not calculate class rank.
- The curriculum consists of rigorous college-preparatory academics in all subject areas. As such, all courses are taught at either the Advanced Placement (AP) or Honors level. In 2018-19, we removed the "Honors" label on course titles but continue to add weighting in the GPA.
- 19 AP and 61 honors courses
- All students enrolled in an AP course are required to take the AP exam.
- AP course limits: two in junior year, four in senior year. Exceptions are made on an individual basis. Enrollment in an AP course before 11th grade is highly unusual.
- A copy of the Curriculum Guide, including course offerings by department, is available <u>online</u>.

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- Special Programs:
 - Seminar: A required course for all students, Seminar is designed to develop the <u>10 key competencies</u> through intentional partnerships with outside organizations and is team-taught by our faculty. Seminar is graded on a Pass/Fail basis and one-half credit is awarded per semester.
 - Pathways: Available to Juniors and Seniors, students work on an intensive project in one or more of the following areas: academic, creative, service, and career. Pathways projects receive one-half credit per semester (Pass/Fail).
 - Independent Studies: Available to students as an in-depth study of an academic interest with a faculty mentor. Independent Studies are graded and receive one-half credit per semester.
 - Through our partnerships with <u>One Schoolhouse</u> and <u>Laurel Springs</u>, students are permitted to enroll in online courses with approval from the Dean of Teaching and Learning. Online courses are listed on the transcript but do not contribute to the Saint Mary's GPA.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE CLASS OF 2020

The school year is divided into two semesters, and the expected course load is seven courses per semester. Diploma requirements include a minimum of 20 units, including:
